New models of mobility in Europe

The technological breakthrough and the Vision Zero

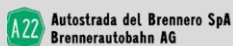
MADONNA DI CAMPIGLIO (Trento, Italy) | 3rd – 5th April 2022

The need to react on the one hand to the economic crisis caused by the pandemic and on the other to the worrying advance of global warming has triggered an epoch-making change in the European Union and its Member States, also and perhaps above all in the transport sector. This, combined with rapid advances in technology, is laying the foundations for a real revolution in the field of mobility. The digitalization of the highways, the development and deployment of autonomous driving vehicles, the end of the endothermic engine and the consequent ecological transition, together with a new concept of inter-modality are all elements that contribute to outlining a horizon in which the inertial evolution of the sector will necessarily give way to the definition of new mobility models. The offer of alternative and closed modes of transport will have to be replaced by a plural offer that proves to be advantageous both for the user and for the environment. Even within the various sectors, first and foremost the highways' sector, the chaotic sum of individualisms will be replaced by cooperative models in which the prevailing feature will be the interconnection of vehicles among themselves and with the infrastructure, called upon to play a role of harmonization and guidance of the users' needs.

Such a revolution will have an extraordinary impact in the field of safety. ASECAP and its members consider road safety as the priority mission that guides their work based on the Vision Zero objective indicated by the European Commission, which is not intended to be a utopian goal, but a working method aimed at bringing the number of road accident victims to zero as quickly as possible. In recent years, this approach has produced significant results, especially in the highway sector, which has seen a significant fall in the accident rates and in the number of victims. Nevertheless, the curve is now tending towards a worrying flattening, due to a variable that to date has been incompressible: human error. The Traffic Police can intensify every form of control, highways concessionaires can provide perfect highways infrastructure, vehicle manufacturers can improve the impact resistance of their products, but if the driver does not look where he is going, is in an altered state, or violates every rule of law and prudence, the accident remains inevitable.

This and much more will be discussed at the 14th annual ASECAP Road Safety Conference. Organized in collaboration with AISCAT and Autostrada del Brennero, with the participation of the Italian Traffic Police, the 2022 edition will be held from April 3 to 5 in a location that needs no introduction: Madonna di Campiglio.

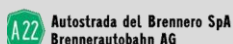
